REQUEST FOR TERMINATION OF CONTINUED SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

The following information affects your right to receive continuing child support services. Please read carefully and sign this form only if you no longer want continued services.

You have the right to continued child support services after you stop receiving public assistance (welfare). Child support services include:

Establishment of paternity
Establishment of a support order
Enforcement of a support order
Review and adjustment of current support orders
Collection of current monthly support and arrears owed to you and/or the state

After you stop receiving public assistance, the Welfare Division will coordinate your case with your local District Attorney's Office, who will continue to provide the above-listed services to you at no cost.

Should you decide to terminate child support services and reapply at a later date with the District Attorney's Office, you may be be required to pay certain fees, such as a \$5.00 - \$12.00 fee for each IRS collection intercepted (variation in fees are due to IRS changes), genetic testing costs to establish paternity and/or out-of-state collection fees as determined by other states.

Services automatically continue unless you sign and return this form to the Nevada State Welfare Division, Child Support Enforcement Program.
