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To Whom It May Concern:

Per previous conversations, I am authorizing Churchill County Health Department to plan, coordinated, conduct, order medication, and any other necessary tasks to provide Monoclonal Antibody Therapy on an outpatient basis and times and locations to be determined by Churchill County.

I understand that these Monoclonal Antibody Therapy medications are currently authorized under an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) and make no further assessment of its safety and efficacy than what has been provided in the *Fact Sheet for Health Care Providers Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) of REGEN-COV (casirivimab and indevimab)*. If additional medications are authorized for future use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration I will review those medications at that time, upon the request of Churchill County Health Department.

I agree to be the ordering practitioner for obtaining medication from the State of Nevada through the Division of Emergency Management, Board of Pharmacy or through whatever other source may be identified by Churchill County.

Patients must receive a valid order for administration for the medication from a licensed medical practitioner before receiving this medication. Patients must be screened under the supervision of a Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Physician, Physician Assistant, Nurse Practitioner, Paramedic, or Advanced EMT. At least one of the listed clinical staff will be present at the location for continued monitoring or emergency treatment as required by special protocol. Should there be any changes to the authorization to administer this medication I will update this in writing.

I authorize Churchill County to convey my licensure information to the Board of Pharmacy, Division of Emergency Management, or other entity to source Monoclonal Antibody Therapy medications for this purpose.


I will continue to serve as the Chief Medical Officer for Churchill County Health Department personnel who participate in outpatient Monoclonal Antibody Therapy administration that are within the geographic boundaries of Churchill County.

I request that Churchill County Health Department review any applicable guidance documents regarding documentation, record keeping, patient records, reporting requirements, etc. and maintain documentation in compliance with said guidance. Churchill County Health Department personnel are required to ensure complete

documentation of each patient encounter through a mechanism to be determined by Churchill County Health Department.
